Receiving divine grace from God on high
And strengthened by its power, O glorious Chad,

Great Lent starts following the Liturgy with:

Vespers of Forgiveness, including

Psalm 103

Great Prokeimenon with refrain:

Turn not away your face from your servant, for I am in trouble;

Hear me speedily: hearken to my soul and deliver it.

- v. 1 Let your salvation, O God, succour me.
- v. 2 Let the poor see it and be glad.
- v. 3 Seek God and your soul shall live.

Prayer of St Ephraim. This is traditionally accompanied by full prostrations, in which we fall on hands and knees and touch the ground with our foreheads:

Lord and Master of my life, give me not a spirit of sloth, idle curiosity, lust for power and useless chatter;

Rather grant your servant a spirit of chastity, humility, patience and love;

Yes, Lord and King, grant me to see my own faults and not to judge my brother,

For blessed are you to the ages of ages. Amen

It concludes with the ceremony of mutual forgiveness, accompanied by lesser prostrations (touching the ground with the right hand) while the choir sings the Katavasias hymns of Easter.
